

33 DAYS TO MORNING GLORY

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Friday is the feast day of one of the most unexplainably overlooked saints of the Church, **Saint Bernard of Clairvaux** (1090-1153). He

is not to be confused with another St. Bernard, St. Bernard de Menthon, who founded the monastery that became famous for the lovable Swiss rescue dogs, but had to be content with being one of the most illustrious figures of the Middle Ages.

Rev. Bruno Scott James, who edited and translated a rewarding book on Bernard's letters, paid eloquent tribute to him when he wrote that

Every age has its great men. They strut across the pages of history full of sound and fury, and then they are gone. Darkness overtakes them and the dust they stir up by their brief...progress settles into the dry records of their biographers. Great men they may be, but they are of their age and with their age they pass away. Yet some few are great enough to transcend the limitations of their age with a message for all time. Shining more with the light of God than with their own, the light they shed remains to inspire men to seek the things that are above and to guide their steps through the storms and darkness of life. Such a man, beyond all question, was Saint Bernard of Clairyaux.

In the twelfth century the Cistercians became the Church's dominant monastic force, launching a reform movement that intended to adopt strict adherence to the ancient Rule of St. Benedict, revered as the founder of western monasticism. The monks who founded the Cistercians had previously belonged to the wealthy and powerful Cluniac monks, but wanted a more austere way of life emphasizing stringent penance and simplicity. One branch of the Cistercians came to be known as the Trappists, who begin their communal prayers at 2:00 a.m. and today support themselves by making and selling products that range from beautiful and expensive vestments to tasty fudge and gourmet jellies.

Bernard became the abbot of their remote and almost desert-like monastery at Citeaux in the forbiddingly named French valley of Wormwood. Soon this Cistercian abbey generated 67 daughter monasteries, and the home valley came to be known as Clairvaux (the valley of light). Besides the monasteries that stemmed from Clairvaux, hundreds of other

Cistercian foundations arose throughout Europe. Famed for his writings, St.
Bernard came to be numbered as one of the Doctors (or great teachers) of the Church. He also served the Church in various diplomatic assignments popes of his era asked him to undertake, which included preaching in support of the second Crusade and mediating many ecclesiastical disputes.

Bernard could be blunt in his writings. The famous Trappist Thomas Merton noted that he

wrote to a bishop-elect:

It is laid down that we should love others as we love ourselves. But if you were to love others as you have hitherto loved yourself, I for one would not wish to be committed to your care.

St. Bernard could also be lavishly articulate in his praise. When a young priest named Philip stopped by Clairvaux on his way to the Holy Land, he became so impressed by the life there that he joined the Cistercians. Bernard commented that

He is no longer an inquisitive onlooker, but a devout inhabitant and an enrolled citizen of Jerusalem; but not of that earthly Jerusalem to which Mount Sinai in Arabia is joined, and which is in bondage with her children, but of that free Jerusalem which is above and the mother of us all. And this, if you want to know, is Clairvaux.


