



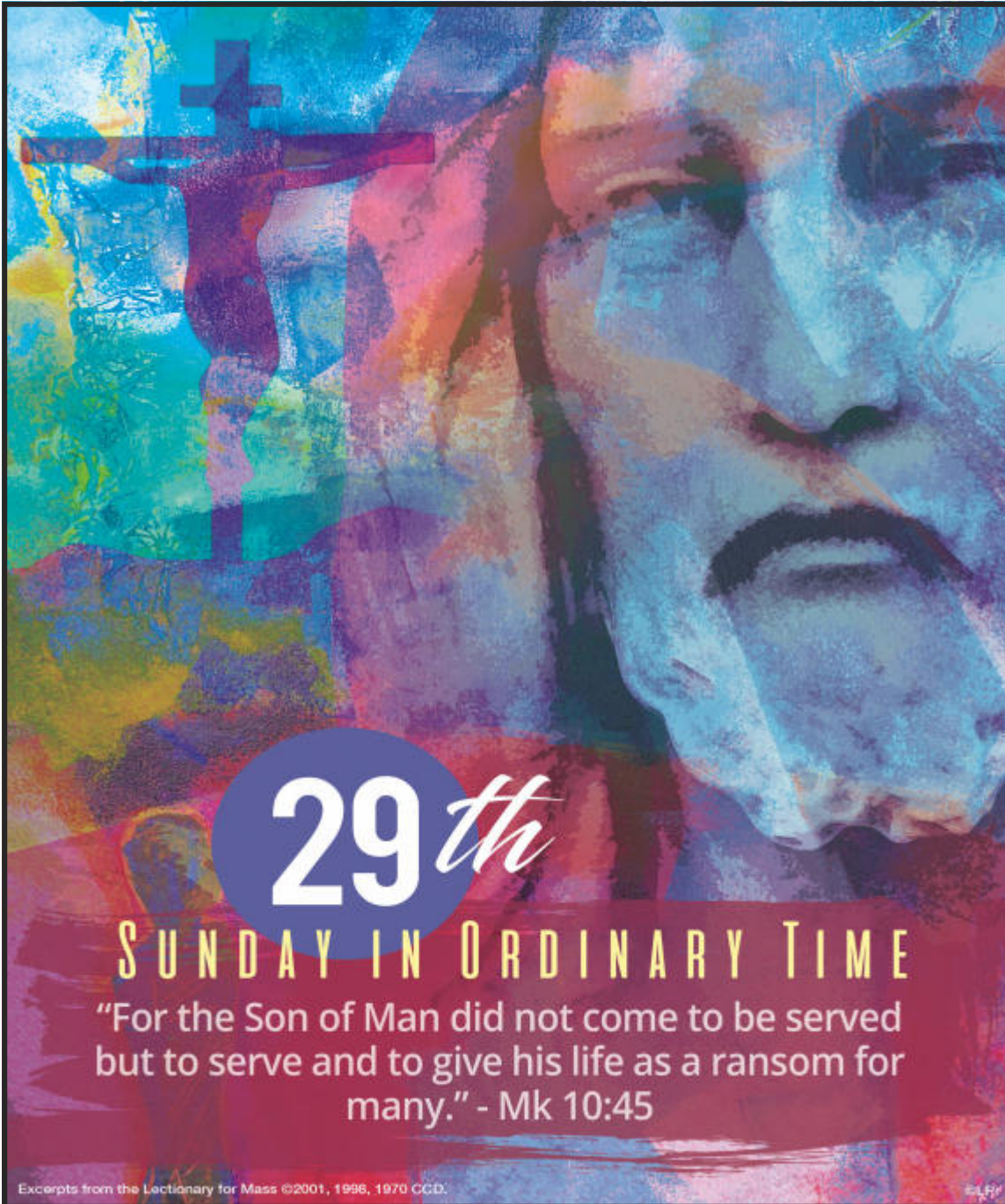

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

On the third day of the Civil War's Battle of Gettysburg, the decisive occurrence was Pickett's Charge, a Confederate assault on a strong Union position that was Robert Lee's greatest failure and won the battle for the North. The prelude to the southern attack was an artillery duel that was not exceeded until the World Wars of the twentieth century. When three hundred guns exchanged fire for half an hour, the historian James M. McPherson wrote, their sounds could be heard in Pittsburgh. This reminds me of how the mantra "Follow the science" has so often been heard during these months of the Covid-19 pandemic from public health officials, political leaders and opinion voices of the media.

Since October has been a month that includes a strong Right-to-Life message from our Church, I think about why this advice has not been applied to the destruction of growing, even viable children, who have been aborted in astounding numbers since the *Roe v. Wade* decision of 1973 and its expansive implications ever since. The original ruling addressed the fate of unborn babies in the first trimester of pregnancy, but has somehow come to be extended to babies able to live independently and even ones who are alive after the abortion procedure has been carried out. Furthermore, the Hyde Amendment, which for years kept abortions from being paid for by taxpayers, has recently been disavowed.

So, what does "the science" have to say about the inception and growth of human life? That has long been clear. From the time when the human egg and sperm unite, a new life is formed.

A few years ago an outstanding 3-volume reference work appeared: *Encyclopedia of Catholic Social Thought, Social Science, and Social Policy*. It would be ideal if every parish and public library had a set. I excavated six of its articles for this piece.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, with its usual apt summary of our beliefs, states that

Human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception. From the first moment of his existence, a human being must be recognized as having the rights of a person—among which is the inviolable right of every innocent being to life.

This is so because every zygote (the fused union of parents' genetic contribution to life) is a unique individual reality which, if not interfered with, results

in the birth of a new child. This is settled, inarguable science, not uncertain or debatable assertion.

The strongest and most elegantly expressed Church teaching on the respect for life issues in recent times was Pope St. John Paul II's 1995 encyclical *Evangelium Vitae* (*The Gospel of Life*). It speaks of the "marvelous process of the unfolding of life," reminding us that "right from fertilization the adventure of human life begins," which is "a most beautiful thing, ... an event worthy of being exalted in joy and glory." The encyclical is a powerful affirmation of "the incomparable and inviolable worth of every human life," something we must never forget to acknowledge and to respect in our living. As John Paul wrote:

... in every child which is born and in every person who lives and dies we see the image of God's glory.

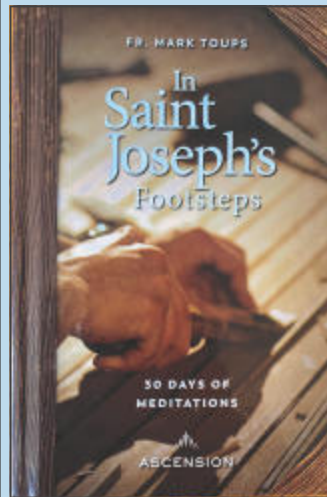

BLUE MASS

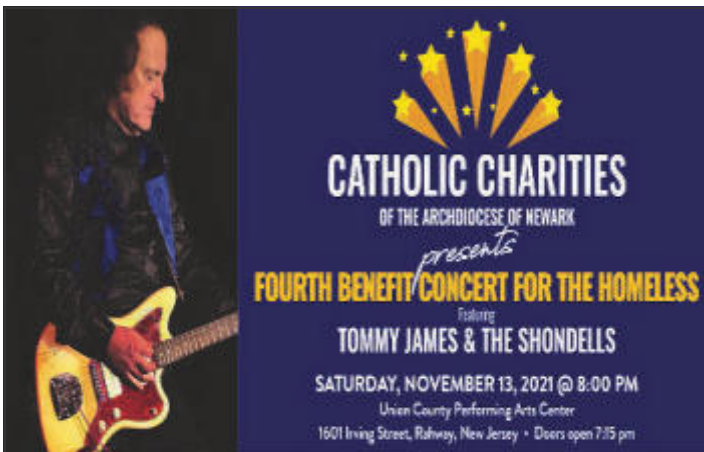

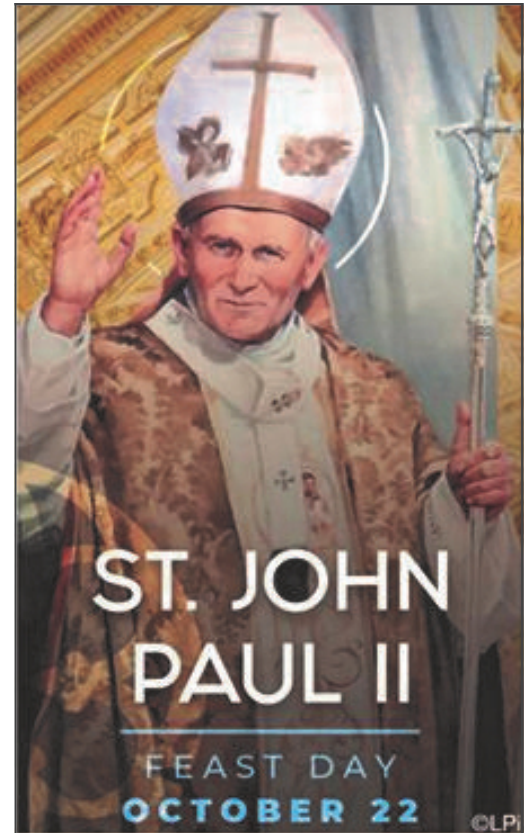

YOU ARE REGISTERED
AT SAINT JOSEPH**

Whether you've been attending Mass at Saint Joseph for years but never actually registered, or you are brand new to our parish, you will want to call our Parish Office at **201-261-1144** to arrange to register.

WHY REGISTER?

1. If you are asked to be a godparent for a child's baptism or a sponsor for a young person's Confirmation, or if another parish needs **verification of your status as a practicing Catholic**, we cannot provide such documentation if you are not registered (and have been an active parishioner for at least several months).
2. Registering your child in our **Religious Education Program** requires that the families of those attending must be parishioners of Saint Joseph.
3. In order to **receive the Sacraments** of Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, Confirmation or Holy Matrimony, you will need to be a registered member.
4. In **times of joy and in times of struggle** (especially with the death of a loved one), it is comforting to have the support of a faith family.
5. The parish will be able to **communicate with you** directly, keeping you informed of **important events and news**.
6. Registration enables you and your family to **be counted and heard** in the parish.
7. Being included in the demographics of the parish **helps in the planning for the needs of the parish**.
8. The Archdiocese will know that Saint Joseph has a **healthy base of registered, supportive parishioners**.
9. You will have **access to end-of-the-year tax contribution statements**.
10. Registration will facilitate **your commitment to practice your faith** and provide you with opportunities and support—through **praying, serving, giving, learning and belonging**—as you journey in our Catholic faith.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. John Paul II was born Karol Wojtyła in the small Polish town of Wadowice. During World War II, when the Nazis invaded Poland, Karol secretly studied for the priesthood in an underground seminary. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1946, appointed Archbishop of Krakow in 1964, and three years later he was made a cardinal. In 1978, he was elected the 264th pope, where he took the name John Paul II.

St. John Paul II made evangelization a key part of his papacy and made pastoral visits to all parts of the world. In 1981, he was shot twice in an assassination attempt. Following Jesus' example of compassion, he later met with his would-be assassin in his prison cell, where he forgave him for what he had done.

St. John Paul II was well-known to be an active sportsman throughout his life, hiking and skiing well into his 60s. In 1992, his health began to decline, and it was later discovered that he suffered from Parkinson's disease, a degenerative disorder of the central nervous system.

Near the end of his papacy, it became difficult for him to speak, and his poor health and physical suffering made public appearances difficult. Still, he continued his pastoral work. He died April 2, 2005, and he was declared blessed on May 1, 2011. He became a saint on April 27, 2014.

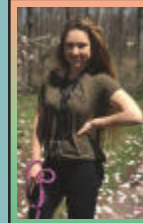
