

Wednesday is the anniversary of the Battle of the Milvian Bridge, which took place near

Rome on October 27, 312 A.D. It is one of history's most consequential events.

Until it took place, Christians had a precarious existence in the Roman Empire. Not long before it, there were terrible sporadic persecutions of believers. But in the early fourth century there were four contenders for the imperial throne, and in 312 the two strongest,

Maxentius and Constantine (who improbably were brothers-in-law), were about to go to war for western dominance. The day before the battle, Constantine had a vision of a flaming cross suspended in the sky, accompanied by the saying "By this sign you will conquer." Constantine ordered the image to be incorporated into his banner and the helmets and shields of his soldiers. After his victory, he and Licinius, the regional ruler of the eastern empire, agreed to issue the Edict of Milan, which granted toleration to Christians. Twelve years later, Constantine overcame Licinius and became the sole ruler of the Roman Empire.

Constantine made Christianity a virtual state religion, curbing pagan practices with mild measures, abolishing crucifixion because of its connection with *(continued above)*

the death of Jesus, and even writing a prayer his soldiers were expected to recite. Oddly, Constantine was baptized only shortly before he died, a practice sometimes adopted by those who wanted to enter the next life unsullied by sins.

There is a statue of "Saint"
Constantine in our cathedral.
Wanting to verify this, I called our
Archdiocese's most knowledgeable
researcher on the Basilica of the
Sacred Heart, Father Michael
Gubernat. He assured me that there
was such a statue: a wooden one

embedded in the screening that separates the sanctuary from its surrounding ambulatory, near the Archbishop's chair. Although Constantine was apparently never canonized by the Catholic Church, he is regarded as a saint by several of the Orthodox Churches, so his title is not completely indefensible.

On the opposite side of the sanctuary there is a statue of Constantine's mother, St. Helena, who is most notably honored for her discovery of the Lord's true cross in Jerusalem. The great novelist Evelyn Waugh, arguably the finest English stylist of modern times, wrote a slim novel about her called *Helena*, which he regarded as his favorite work. It offers a thoroughly enjoyable reading experience to anyone who takes advantage of its riches.

You may also include the name of your loved one who died this year (even if their funeral was not celebrated at Saint Joseph) if you will be attending this Mass.



PLENARY INDULGENCE

GRANTED BY THE HOLY SEE TO THOSE PARTICIPATING

In conjunction with the *three usual conditions* (sacramental Confession, reception of Eucharistic Communion and prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father), individuals participating in these days of **meditation and the consecration to St. Joseph** can receive the gift of a **plenary indulgence** during this special Year of St. Joseph (which concludes on December 8, 2021.) The indulgence is granted *under the conditions mentioned above*, to the faithful who, with a spirit detachd from any sin, participate in the Year of St. Joseph in the manner indicated by the Apostolic Penitentiary.

In addition to participating in the **30 Days of Meditations and Consecration to St. Joseph**, the faithful can receive an indulgence (also under the aforementioned conditions) by meditating for at least 30 minutes on the Our Father; performing a corporal or spiritual work of mercy; reciting the Rosary as a family; entrusting their work daily in prayer to St. Joseph; praying the "Litany of St. Joseph" (or other approved prayer) for the relief of all persecuted Christians.

The gift of plenary indulgence also extends particularly to the **elderly, sick, dying** and those who for legitmate reasons **cannot leave their homes**. They, with a spirit detached from any sin and with the intention of fulfilling, as soon as possible, the three usual conditions, can receive an indulgence by praying an act of piety in honor of St. Joseph, offering God the pains and difficulties of their own lives.



FEATURING VERONICA'S VEIL —Our Altar Linens Ministry

"Vernoica's Veil" is a group of faithful parishdioners who launder (in their own homes) the altar linens used in the celebration of the Mass.



Among those linens are (a) **Purificators**—cloths used to wipe the chalice and Communion cup and to clean them thoroughly after Mass; (b) the **Corporal**—a square white linen or cotton cloth upon which the chalice and paten are placed; (c)the **Pall**—a drape of fabric that is used to cover the chalice and paten to protect them from dust, etc.; (d) **Hand Towels**—used by the priest to cleanse his hands during the Consecration; and occasionally linen **Altar Cloths** (tablecloths for the altar).

AN IMPORTANT LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

I am very grateful to all the parishioners for their continued support and generosity throughout this past year. Through your generosity, Saint Joseph Parish and its many ministries can continue to do the work of the Lord.

Below are some key points for the **PARISH FINANCIAL REPORT** for the fiscal year that ended June 30, 2021, which can be seen opposite this letter on **page 7** of our bulletin.

- Saint Joseph Church had a deficit before Capital Projects of (\$34,157) and an overall deficit of (\$41,341) for fiscal year ended June 30, 2021.
- Electronic giving has grown to 50% over the last year and a half and has really helped to sustain the Parish. If you have not already done so, please consider signing up for electronic giving at: sjcnj.org
- Sunday and Holyday collections totaled \$611,900, which was \$6,900 over the budget but \$12,397 (2%) lower than the previous year.
- Donations, Gifts, Bequests and Grants totaled \$81,290, which was \$33,073 higher than last year. Parishioners have been generous in donating for restricted purposes, particularly for repairs and maintenance. We are grateful for these donations, as the aging physical plant is always in need of repair.
- Overall expenses, for last year were lower than expected. However, this was mainly due to reduced in-person activities. Covid-19 restrictions caused many Parish programs and activities to be run virtually or to be cancelled.
- Plant related and utilities expenses totaled \$107,539 last year. We were fortunate that a capital roof repair expense of \$87,385 was mostly covered by insurance.
- The Parish is anticipating a (\$114,525) deficit for fiscal year 2022.
- A special thank you to all the Parishioners who contributed to the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal. Since the Parish met its goal by June 30, 2021, our assessment expense for the upcoming fiscal year has been reduced by \$16,293, which in turn reduces our anticipated deficit.

Father John, Father Christian and I, along with the Trustees and Finance Council, will continue to do our best to be good stewards of the Parish finances. We thank you for your generosity over the past year and ask for your continued support during the upcoming year.

May God continue to bless our Saint Joseph Church family!






