RCIA prepares adults to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and/or First Eucharist. While the RCIA process is primarily for adults seeking baptism, adaptations are made for baptized Christians of other denominations who are seeking to join the Catholic Church, and for baptized Catholics who are seeking to complete their initiation into the faith. #### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Few nowadays have ever heard of the song "Silver Threads Among the Gold," although it was immensely popular in its day and for many years after. It was released in 1873, the same year that saw the appearance of "Blessed Assurance" and "Old-Time Religion." Hart P. Danks wrote its music and Eben Rexford the lyrics. The song sold more than 3 million copies. When songs were reproduced acoustically, it was the most frequently recorded song of all. A 1932 poll by WABC Radio in New York that asked respondents to name their favorite song placed it first. Over the years it has been recorded by famous singers, including John McCormack, Bing Crosby and Jerry Lee Lewis. Some of the song's lyrics read:

Darling, I am growing old, Silver threads among the gold, Shine upon my brow today, Life is fading fast away. But, my darling, you will be Always young and fair to me....

#### [Chorus]

Love can never more grow old, Locks may lose their brown and gold; Cheeks may fade and hollow grow, But the hearts that love will know, Never, never winter's frost and chill; Summer warmth is in them still....

Life didn't work out well for Danks. A year after his song was released, his marriage failed. He never saw his wife again. In 1903 the landlady of the poor rooming house in Philadelphia where he resided found his dead body on the floor next to his piano. By his side was a copy of "Silver Threads Among the Gold". On it, he had written, "It's hard to die alone...."

On this Father's Day, I hope the fathers of our parish can look upon their own marriages with grateful hearts. Jesus Christ counts on the efforts of men living as good husbands and fathers to get so much of his most important work done.

Every Christian marriage is meant to be a reflection of what God wants the Church to be and to accomplish. Happy Father's Day to each of you!

#### WITH SPECIAL THANKS FROM DIANE HELLRIEGEL It is with much sadness that after almost

28 years of service to Saint Joseph Parish, I find I must retire. This past April, I experienced a stroke that took place in

the left frontal lobe (the area responsible for language) and caused me to have trouble forming words and remembering things.

Since then, I have been truly blessed to learn that I will most likely recover from any language problems, with a little help from speech therapy. I know this is all due to your kind and generous prayers. I am forever grateful.

However, because I still do not know what caused the stroke, I am afraid that I must now take a step back from my parish work.

Monsignor Hubba offered me this wonderful opportunity to extend my thanks to many of the people who have helped me during my time at Saint Joseph. If I have forgotten anyone, please know that everything you did for me will never be forgotten. I will always be indebted to you.

In the early 1990's, when our pastor, **Fr. George Reilly** (recognizing that he may have found a brand new volunteer), asked me to take over working with our parish nurses and catechists in our early childhood program "Good News for Little Ones" (originally started by Fr. Tom Iwanowski), he may have foreseen that I had a future with the children of our parish.

And indeed I did, as evidenced by my volunteering to teach every grade from Preschool to Grade 8 in our Religious Education program for the next ten years--1992-2001! (Thank you DRE **Annette Ziegler** for making it possible for me to earn my certification as a catechist.)

These experiences went on to make me a likely candidate to work part time as Assistant to the Director of Religious Education from 1995-1996. And when **Sr. Aurelia Cerny** (principal of SJS), asked me to fill in for the Religion teacher who was teaching Kindergarten-Grade 2, and then made the decision to hire me on a full time basis, I was both amazed and delighted. Who would have thought that such a step would lead me on a faith journey like no other—one that lasted for 14 years at Saint Joseph School...and ten more with the parish.

As part of the team of dedicated Religion teachers at SJS, I learned so much from **Sister Winifred Guinan** and **Sr. Michael Marie** (who taught Gr. 3-5 and Gr. 6-8 respectively.) And a few years later, I *(continued above)*  was blessed even more to have **Mrs. Rita Canino** as another truly wonderful coworker. Classroom teachers, like our veterans **Miss Mary Lee** and **Mrs. Maureen Asaro**, helped to teach me so much about classroom management and student behavior.

When **Mrs. Colette Vail** came on board to serve as Saint Joseph's first lay principal, I was excited to be given the chance to work as our school's Religion Coordinator, to plan our school liturgies, to prepare our May Crowning and to work with Mrs. Vail in planning our annual school Retreats—something truly unique to our school and of which we were both very proud.

And it was during Mrs. Vail's tenure that we worked together (along with our Religious Education program and our wonderful **Mrs. Arlene Kennedy,** who continues to serve our Communion and Confirmation candidates) to help the children of Saint Joseph School prepare for the Sacraments. What an amazing gift that was! Hundreds of second-graders from Saint Joseph School made their First Communion in the years I was blessed to serve there—a memory I will never ever forget.

In 2010, **Fr. Tom Iwanowski** succeeded Fr. Reilly as pastor of Saint Joseph Parish. Fr. Tom worked tirelessly to bring Saint Joseph into the 21<sup>st</sup> Century, with such programs as a new parish website, Facebook pages (parish and school), E-Newsletters sent to both school and parish emails, printed posters for parish events, additional promotional materials, as well as the management of our parish domains and parish email addresses.

And because it was at this time that the Archdiocese made the decision to remove the dedicated Religion programs (and have each classroom teacher share their own faith), and because I had previously worked in marketing and communications, Fr. Tom asked me to take on these many different projects the parish would now be undertaking—additionally including the creating and editing of the weekly Parish Bulletin.

For the next 10 years, from 2011-2020, I worked full time as Communications Director for both Saint Joseph Parish *and* School, as well as taking photos at school and parish events. *(Thanks, Monroe Quinn and Ellen Solinas, for your help!)* It was a busy time!

In 2020, with problems created by the pandemic, Saint Joseph School had to eliminate my position and the Parish could only retain me as part time. Many of my previous roles now are being handled by some truly amazing and dedicated volunteers,

I am truly grateful to Our Lord, and to each one of you, for the many blessings, the countless faith-enriching experiences, the incredible rewards and challenges that have made this journey of mine such a truly joyous one. I hope to be able to see many of you at Mass in the near future. May God bless you all! And may he continue to bless our beloved Saint Joseph Church.
