### FROM THE DESK OF FR. CHRISTIAN SCALO



On behalf of the parish of St. Joseph, Fr. John, Deacon George, our dedicated staff, ministers, and faithful people, I extend to you and your families our very best wishes for a Happy Easter. This is the day... this is the day that we celebrate the victory of our Lord

Jesus over death. The day we celebrate the new life He has won for us. The day we come together as a family, united in our belief that God loves and cares for us and always welcomes us to draw closer to Himself and to one another.

As Catholic Christians we truly believe that God, the eternal Word, the Creator of the stars in the sky and the depths of the sea became man.
