A note from Fr. Christian



The Lord has a special message and a mission for each and every one of us. Regardless of who is reading this article today... whether you are older or younger, still in school, working, or retired, a long time parishioner here at St. Joseph's or just visiting or joining us for the

first time: You are chosen. Really and truly chosen by God for a special purpose. Each one of us by our Baptism has been hand picked by God to help bring His presence into the world and to bring people closer and closer to Jesus. While there are certainly good things that happen in the world today, there is also a lot of suffering, fear, anxiety, and loneliness (just to name a few!). People are searching...deeply longing to find meaning in their lives, wanting to be loved, trying to discover something beyond the ordinary. Indeed, the human heart is a restless heart and frankly, we will never be completely satisfied by anything that "the world" has to offer. We were made by and for God! St. Augustine puts it best in his famous work, The Confessions of St. Augustine: "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it *rests in you.*" And this is where we as people of faith can play an important role in helping others.

Through the witness of our lives (by striving to live in a good and upright way), through our interactions with others, through our own growth in spirituality and relationship with God, we can point people in the right direction- toward the peace, love, companionship, and hope that is found in Christ alone. It's true... no two of us are the same and we all will have different ways of bringing people deeper into relationship with God. That's the beauty of being a part of a faith community! We can all do our part in a unique way. God has blessed us with different gifts, different skills, different life experiences and perspectives so that we can understand and relate to a variety of people and share our own stories. Evangelization, helping others to become disciples or to grow in their discipleship, involves meeting people where they are in the midst of their current life circumstances- good, bad, or ugly- and helping them to see that they are not alone: that God made them in His image and cares for them, that God wants them and loves them and that God has a plan for them to prosper and succeed.

It's true, the work of evangelization takes a lot of time and effort, but the fruits of our hard work would be nothing short of amazing! Imagine if each one of us could bring back just one other person to the faith. Our church would be full at every Mass! It's not impossible... actually if we work with a spirit of intentionality and put our faith in God, we can and will bring people back. Sure we can't solve every problem, we can't promise a life free from "issues," we can't predict the future. But what we can promise is that Jesus will be with them and us at every moment of our lives... if our heart is open to journeying with Him, striving to make Him the center of our lives, and helping others to do the same.

Contemplative Prayer

We may think of prayer as thoughts or feelings expressed in words. But this is only one expression. In the Christian tradition contemplative prayer is considered to be a pure gift of God. It is the opening of our mind and heart –our whole being—to God, the Ultimate Mystery beyond thoughts, words, and emotions. Through grace we open our awareness to God whom we know by faith is within. Closer than breathing, closer than thinking, closer than choosing, closer that consciousness itself.

Centering Prayer: The Prayer of Consent Centering Prayer is a method designed to facilitate the development of contemplative prayer by preparing our faculties to receive the gift. It presents ancient Christian wisdom teachings in an updated form. Centering prayer is not meant to replace other kinds of prayer; rather it casts a new light and depth of meaning on them. It is at the same time a relationship with God and a discipline to foster that relationship. This method of prayer is a movement beyond conversation with Christ to communion with Him.
