A note from Fr. Christian



If we take a step back and look at our life, I think we will find that we put our trust in a lot of things! When we read a textbook or reference work, we trust that the information presented is accurate and true. When we get in the car and

drive to run some errands, we trust that the car will start and get us where we need to go. When we go to the grocery store and buy food, we trust that the label on the product actually shows what the product is and what is in the product! The list goes on and on...

Sometimes it can be so difficult to trust can't it? Especially when someone says those words, "trust me!" I'm sure many, if not all, of us can point to a moment in our lives when we trusted someone only to find that they were being dishonest. Betrayal is one of the most difficult things that any of us can experience; it can be very painful and even make us question whether we could trust anyone ever again. That being said, I am also sure that many of us have placed our trust in someone and everything turned out to be fine and wonderful! Our lives can be very complicated and feel like a roller coaster!

Consider the fishermen in the boat in today's Gospel. One could only imagine how exhausted and defeated they felt after being out all night desperately trying to bring in a good catch and coming up with nothing to show for all the hard work. Surely, Peter dug deep within himself to take that chance and lower the nets one more time at Jesus' prompting. Despite all the obstacles, Peter trusted in Jesus and it resulted in abundant blessings- a vast number of fish that they would never have thought they could catch.

Growing in Faith and Knowledge: Excerpts from the Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church

In this new section of the bulletin, we will highlight different teachings found in the Compendium, with the hope that it helps all of us to grow in basic knowledge of our faith, thereby leading us closer to Jesus!

Why does the human race form a unity?

All people form the unity of the human race by reason of the common origin which they have from God. God has made "from one ancestor all the nations of men" (*Acts* 17:26). All have but one Savior and are called to share in the eternal happiness of God.

How do the soul and body form a unity in the human being?

The human person is a being at once corporeal and spiritual. In man spirit and matter form one nature. This unity is so profound that, thanks to the spiritual principle which is the soul, the body which is material, becomes a living human body and participates in the dignity of the image of God.

Where does the soul come from?

The spiritual soul does not come from one's parents but is created immediately by God and is immortal. It does not perish at the moment when it is separated from the body in death and it will be once again reunited with the body at the moment of the final resurrection.
