

"Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own? How can you say to your brother, 'Brother, let me remove that splinter in your eye,' when you do not even notice the

wooden beam in your own eye? You hypocrite! Remove the wooden beam from your eye first; then you will see clearly to remove the splinter in your brother's eye" (Luke Luke 6:41-42).

One of the greatest challenges that we can have as disciples is honest self-reflection. It's so easy to notice the faults, failures, weaknesses of others, but it can be difficult at times to look inward the mirror at our own! All of us have places in our lives that could use the grace and mercy of God. Self reflection and identifying those places of weakness isn't about being hard on ourselves or nit picky. It's not about putting ourselves down. Rather, it's about honestly looking at our life with the loving and compassionate presence of God guiding us and recognizing those places within us that need healing.

Then like the Scripture says, we will start to see clearly enough, so as to help our brothers and sisters on their path toward healing and wholeness as well.

PLEASE NOTE!

The monthly Parish Adoration has been moved to Wednesday, March 12 because of Ash Wednesday.

2025 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of <u>both Fast and Abstinence</u> during Lent are **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.** The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of **Fast**, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity. *Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.*

On a day of **Abstinence**, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

2. The time for fulfilling the **Paschal Precept** (Easter Duty) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, March 9, 2025 to The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, June 15, 2025.

The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially" or as a whole, is a serious obligation.

Growing in Faith and Knowledge: Excerpts from the Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church

In this new section of the bulletin, we will highlight different teachings found in the Compendium, with the hope that it helps all of us to grow in basic knowledge of our faith, thereby leading us closer to Jesus!

What other consequences derive from original sin?

In consequence of original sin human nature, without being totally corrupted, is wounded in its natural powers. It is subject to ignorance, to suffering, and to the dominion of death and is inclined toward sin. This inclination is called *concupiscence*.

After the first sin, what did God do?

After the first sin the world was inundated with sin but God did not abandon man to the power of death. Rather, he foretold in a mysterious way in the "Protoevangelium" (*Genesis* 3:15) that evil would be conquered and that man would be lifted up from his fall. This was the first proclamation of the Messiah and Redeemer. Therefore, the fall would be called in the future a "happy fault" because it "gained for us so great a Redeemer" (Liturgy of the Easter Vigil).

What is the Good News for humanity?

It is the proclamation of Jesus Christ, the "Son of the living God" (*Matthew* 16:16), who died and rose from the dead. In the time of King Herod and the Emperor Caesar Augustus, God fulfilled the promises that he made to Abraham and his descendants. He sent "his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons" (*Galatians* 4:4-5).

To quote Carlo's own words: "Our destination must be what is infinite, not what is finite. Infinity is our brief mediand. We have been expected in Heaven since time immemorial". He also said: "All are born with their own originality, but many die as shottoccoice".

In the entire history of the Catholic Church, there have been numerous Eucharistic miracles approved by the Catholic Church as truly worthy of belief. The Vatican Eucharistic Miracles Photographic Exhibition faithfully recounts for us many well documented miraculous occurrences. Knowledge of these miracles strengthens our faith in Christ and His Church. They are visible proof of Jesus Christ's Real Presence in the Holy Eucharist. The Exhibit was created by Blessed Carlo Acutis, a 15 year old from Milan, Italy who was Beatified on October 10, 2020 and will be Canonized on Sunday, April 27, 2025.

Saint Joseph Youth Ministry will host this exhibit, which includes the relic of Carlos Acutis.

Born in Philadelphia, St. Katharine Drexel (November 26, 1858 – March 3, 1955), grew up to become one of the first American-born saints. Her mother passed away when she was only five weeks old. Her father, a renowned banker, remarried a wonderful woman, and together they

raised St. Katherine Drexel and her two sisters in a life of privilege. Both financially and spiritually well-endowed, the Drexels were devout Catholics and set an excellent example of true Christian servitude with prayer and care for the poor. After her father's death, St. Katharine considered joining a contemplative order. However, during an audience with the Pope while on a trip to Rome with her sister, when she asked for more missionaries to be sent to the American West, the Pope asked her to become a missionary herself! Now known as the Apostle for Social Justice, St. Katharine gave up her inheritance and instead devoted her life to the material and spiritual well-being of Black and Native Americans. She established the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament for Indians and Colored, and together they opened a boarding school in Santa Fe, the first of 50 missions for Native Americans in 16 states. At the time of her death, she had also established a system of 63 schools, including Xavier University in New Orleans, the first Catholic university in the United States for African Americans. Believing that education was the key to opportunity, her love of the Blessed Sacrament sustained her mission.

At 77, she suffered a heart attack and was forced to retire from active ministry. She spent the next 20 years of her life in quiet yet intense prayer. She died at the age of 96 and was canonized in 2000 by Pope John Paul II. St. Katharine Drexel, pray for us! (LPi)
