

Dear Parents and Guardians,

I am writing with great enthusiasm to announce a new enrichment program at Saint Joseph School. Beginning September 2025, Saint Joseph School and Bergen Catholic High School will collaborate to provide exciting and new experiences for the SJS Middle School. This spirit of collaboration was evident at Grade 8 graduation where the Bergen Catholic Men's Vocal Ensemble, under the direction of Mrs. Periano, joined the SJS students, under the direction of Mrs. Cara Zakian, to sing *Count on Me*.

This *new* work is both exciting and challenging. Father Christian Scalo, Pastor has been engaged in conversations with the Archdiocese of Newark Schools Office about strengthening the educational mission of St. Joseph School. I have recently joined these discussions and now, SJS and Bergen Catholic are ready to implement enrichment opportunities that I am sure will be exciting for current, and new students and families.

In September, we will offer a Catholic Retreat for SJS middle school students. This retreat will be a collaboration between the two schools. SJS Middle School teachers will be working with members of the Bergen Catholic High School staff, including Brother Ben McDonough, Chaplain Sam Monico, and Religion Department Chair, Josh Powers to make this retreat a spiritually uplifting experience for SJS middle school students.

An additional middle school enrichment opportunity is planned with the Bergen Catholic /Holy Name Hospital Honors Science Research program. This initiative will be guided by Mr. Brian Redine, BC Science teacher, and Mrs. Vicki Aquino, SJS Science teacher. I look forward to sharing more details with you over the summer as plans for this collaboration take shape.

As we look to the future for Catholic Schools our aim is to foster a robust educational environment that is competitive with surrounding schools and one that will prepare students for the challenges of high school. Growing in Faith and Knowledge: Excerpts from the Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church

In this new section of the bulletin, we will highlight different teachings found in the Compendium, with the hope that it helps all of us to grow in basic knowledge of our faith, thereby leading us closer to Jesus!

What happened in the Agony in the Garden of Gethsemane?

Despite the horror which death represented for the sacred humanity of Jesus "who is the Author of Life" (Acts 3:15), the human will of the Son of God remained faithful to the will of the Father for our salvation. Jesus accepted the duty to carry our sins in his Body "becoming obedient unto death" (Philippians 2:8).

What are the results of the sacrifice of Christ on the cross?

Jesus freely offered his life as an expiatory sacrifice, that is, he made reparation for our sins with the full obedience of his love unto death. This love "to the end" (*John* 13:1) of the Son of God reconciled all of humanity with the Father. The paschal sacrifice of Christ, therefore, redeems humanity in a way that is unique, perfect, and definitive; and it opens up for them communion with God.

Why does Jesus call upon his disciples to take up their cross?

By calling his disciples to take up their cross and follow him Jesus desires to associate with his redeeming sacrifice those who are to be its first beneficiaries.
